

**CfP End of project colloquium: Sub-task 1.6 Identification and annotation of MWEs in corpus languages (in the COST initiative CA21167)**

I am writing to invite contributions to the end-of-project colloquium of sub-task 1.6 on the identification and annotation of MWEs (multi-word expressions) in corpus languages, in the COST initiative CA21167. If I receive a large number of suitable abstracts, the working-group team will rank them. Presentations would be about 20min in length with 10min of Q&A afterwards.
